## **III. Content of the course**

### *1. Abstract of the course*

Wars, armed conflicts, terrorism, drug trade, ecological disaster, annexations, occupation, post-pandemic crisis – all this has acquired a supra-global level. Problems of this scale require the real involvement of a large number of states, the art of finding compromises and generating solutions, and deepening international cooperation and interaction. In connection with the European integration course of Ukraine and in order to restore the country, it is important to comprehensively study the experience of the European Union regarding the formation of a modern paradigm of peace, security, and justice in the third millennium and the development of a strategy for sustainable, inclusive, intelligent development.

### *2. Purpose and objectives of the course*

The purpose of the course is to study the experience of the countries of the European Union in the development and implementation of the strategy of sustainable, inclusive, smart development and to analyze the possibilities of its adaptation in the modern conditions of Ukraine.

The tasks of the course are the study of the modern paradigm of sustainable, inclusive, smart development, the history of its formation,

theoretical and methodological basis, and EU experience in developing and implementing a strategy of sustainable, inclusive, and smart development. The final result of the course is the analysis of strategic priorities and tasks, and the possibilities of adapting the EU experience in order to build strategies for sustainable, inclusive, smart development in the conditions of recovery of Ukraine.
